AMENDMENT TO APPENDIX B SUBDIVISIONS OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF CARTHAGE, TEXAS, EXTENDING THE CITY OF CARTHAGE SUBDIVISION REGULATIONS AND PROCEDURE OF SUBDIVISIONS TO THE EXTRATERRITORIAL JURISDICTION OF **CARTHAGE**

Section V is added to Appendix B Subdivisions of the Code of Ordinances.

V. That Appendix B Regulations and Procedures of Subdivisions and other municipal ordinances relating to access to public roads are extended to the extraterritorial jurisdiction of the City of Carthage subject to statutory exclusions.

We want to welcome each of you here today, and we understand your concern about your health insurance benefit from the County. I am reading this statement to you, and at the conclusion of my statement, you will each be given a copy of the statement, along with supporting documents.

The County's hospitalization plan started on January 1, 1981. Under that plan retirees over the age of 65 (which meant having Medicare at that time) would have their premiums paid by the County. All retirees under 65 would pay the difference between the cost of their policy and what the County paid for retirees over 65. A copy of that part of the Commissioners' Court Minutes for December 30, 1980 is attached to this statement.

One thing that needs to be pointed out at the beginning is that one Commissioners' Court cannot bind a future Court, because conditions change. The only thing a future Court can be bound to is the repayment of debt.

Over the years the policy has changed to include a prescription drug card. That was added for active employees only after I took office. Retirees did not have the prescription drug card for several years; at my urging, the Commissioners' Court included retirees having the card.

A copy of the County's current policy is attached. On page 1 of that policy, it states in paragraph 3 under "Eligibility" the following: "The above stated eligibility is subject to future change upon action of current insurance carrier and/or the Panola County Commissioners' Court. If changes are made you may have rights under Federal Law regarding continued coverage (COBRA)."

The cost of coverage for retirees with Medicare has steadily risen since 1995 from \$70.87 per month to \$362.21 beginning December 1, 2001. On

December 1, 2002 it will increase to the same rate as active employees, currently \$447.18, as of 12-01-01. It will be more on 12-01-02.

The County cannot continue these high rates for retirees. We suggested two options in our Memo of October 8, 2001:

- 1. Convert you to the Silver Choice, which has a maximum of \$3,000 on the drug portion, with name brand drugs requiring a 50% co-pay. This would be provided for you at no cost to you. This currently cost \$158.00 per month up, depending on age; or
- 2. Keep what the actives have, with you paying 25% of the cost and having practically unlimited drug coverage at the same co-pays as active employees. On 12-01-01, that 25% would have cost you \$111.80 per month. It will be more on 12-01-02, I can assure you.

Most counties require their employees who retire and wish to continue their insurance to pay the full amount. Others require some portion to be paid. Panola County is one of the few, perhaps the only one, who provides it cost free.

Panola County has made every effort to do what it could for its employees and retirees, but there is a limit to all things. We will continue to do what we can, but we would like your understanding that the Commissioners' Court must walk a fine line between what we would like to do for our employees and retirees, and the interests of our taxpayers who pay the bills. The pie is only so big and can be cut into only so many pieces. We want you to have your piece, but it may be smaller than any of us would like.

We will now open the floor to questions and/or comments. Please limit yourself to 5 minutes and limit the discussion to this topic – health insurance benefits for retirees. Also, please be respectful to the Court. We are here to conduct the County's business in an orderly fashion. In order to be

recognized, please raise your hand and state your name. You will be limited to 5 minutes total. We will not give you 5 minutes, then 5 more, etc.

A copy of these remarks will be placed in the record of today's meeting.

Mr. Albert Agnor, representing Astma Life and Casual ty, appeared before the Court and presented a proposed plan of group hospitalization and life insurance, a copy of which is attached hereto.

Upon a motion made by Commissioner Brooks, seconded by Commissioner Davis and unanimously adopted by the Court, this plan of insurance was adopted, effective January 1, 1981 at 12:01 A.M., with retired employees age 65 or older to have their hospitalization insurance premium paid by the County as to all such employees retiring on or after January 1, 1980; with all County retired employees under age 65 to have the choice of paying the difference between the amount paid by the County and the the premium applicable to such County employees under 65 years of age; provided however, that all such retired County employees in order to have such premium paid by the County must be eligible for and participating in the Panols County Retirement Plan.

Upon a motion duly made by Commissioner Ford, seconded by Commissioner Elliott and unanimously adopted by the Corut, the County Judge, County Auditor and Mr. Albert Agnor were delegated and authorized to establish the terms, conditions and terminations pertaining to any payment due by Panola Counby by any retired employee for premiums due for such employee or his spouse.

PANOLA COUNTY POLICY & SELECTION FORMS FOR GROUP MEDICAL INSURANCE CONTINUATION FOR RETIREES & SURVIVING SPOUSES

ELIGIBILITY

Group Medical insurance continuation is available for Retired Employees who are eligible to begin receiving either Service or Disability retirement benefits from the Texas County and District Retirement System during the two months subsequent to employment termination.

Group Medical insurance continuation is available for a surviving spouse who is eligible to begin receiving monthly survivor retirement benefits from the Texas County and District Retirement System during the two months subsequent to the active or retired Employee's death if the surviving spouse was covered by the current group medical plan at the time of the active or retired Employee's death.

The above stated eligibility is subject to future change upon action of current insurance carrier and/or the Panola County Commissioners Court. If changes are made you may have rights under Federal Law regarding continued coverage (COBRA).

BENEFITS

The benefits for this program shall be in accordance with the provisions of the current group medical insurance master contract for Panola County. A copy of the master contract shall be kept in the County Clerk and County Auditor's office and may be reviewed by anyone during normal working hours.

COSTS

An eligible Retired Employee, covered under our current insurance policy, who has Medicare coverage, is entitled to have their group medical insurance premium fully paid by the County.

An eligible Retired Employee, covered under our current insurance policy, who does not have Medicare coverage must pay the difference between the premium applicable to a non Medicare covered Retired Employee and the premium applicable to a Retiree who has Medicare

coverage. When a Retiree covered under our plan obtains Medicare coverage the County will pay all of the applicable premium for the Retiree.

It is the responsibility of the Retiree and Surviving Spouse to notify the County when they or covered dependents become covered under Medicare or when dependents become ineligible for coverage.

The premium of any eligible dependents of a Retiree shall be entirely payable by the Retiree regardless of any Medicare coverage.

Any eligible surviving spouse shall be entirely responsible for the payment of applicable premium regardless of any Medicare coverage.

The premium for any eligible dependents of a surviving spouse shall be entirely payable by the surviving spouse.

The current monthly rates are in accordance with applicable premiums at time of qualifying event. The current rates in force will be provided upon request. Premiums shall be paid to the Panola County upon request. Soffice on or by the 1st day of each month. Failure to remit required payments by the 1st of each month may cause your insurance to be stopped.

SELECTION OF BENEFITS

Any eligible Retired employee or eligible surviving spouse must make application for group medical insurance continuance. This includes completion of the change forms required by the current insurance carrier and the selection form required by this document.

Any required change forms and the attached selection form must be completed for continuation. Forms will be provided upon request. Coverage may not be available if selection form is not completed within thirty (30) days of the service retirement date or the date a survivor spouse began receiving the survivor retirement benefits. In the case of a disability retirement the selection form would need to be completed within thirty (30) days of the official notification by the Texas County & District Retirement System that disability retirement had been approved.

All information on this selection form is considered a part of this policy.

EVERYONE PLEASE READ IN ENTIRETY

During the Commissioners' Court meeting today, we approved health insurance for active employees, retirees without Medicare coverage, and retirees with Medicare coverage.

Again this year, and possibly for the last time, all three groups will be covered by the same policy, except that active employees will also be covered for \$10,000 life and ADD (Accidental Death and Dismemberment).

There will be a few changes in the coverage beginning December 1, 2001.

CHANGES IN COVERAGE 12-01-01 thru 11-30-02

Co-Pay for doctor visits: will go up to \$25.00 from current \$20.00.

Deductible: will go down from current \$750.00 to \$500.00 if "in network"; remains \$750.00 "out of network".

Emergency Room Deductible: will go up to \$75.00 from current \$50.00.

Prescription Drug Card: current \$6/\$20/\$35 goes up to \$10/\$25/\$40.

Diabetic test strips will now be covered under the Prescription Drug Card Program.

Drugs can be purchased locally or mail order can be used with some savings.

RETIREES WITHOUT MEDICARE COVERAGE

Your part of the premium will continue to be the difference between what we pay for retirees with Medicare coverage and the cost of your premium. That amount will be \$84.97. Since there will be no difference in premiums for actives, retirees without Medicare coverage, and retirees with Medicare coverage beginning 12-01-02, we will have to change our policy next year. It will possibly be 25% of whatever your premium is.

RETIREES WITH MEDICARE COVERAGE

The cost of your coverage has gone up dramatically since 1995. At that time, the County paid \$70.87 per month for your coverage. In 2001, the County paid \$351.66 per month. Beginning 12-01-01, the amount the County will pay for your coverage will be \$362.21. On 12-01-02, the rates will rise to the same level as active employees, currently \$447.18. The County cannot continue that expense.

There are two possible alternatives the Court will look at during budget time next June.

Alternative 1:

There is a coverage called BC/BS Silver Choice, which covers everything Medicare does not cover. It has a prescription drug card that will pay for a MAXIMUM of \$3,000.00 per year. You would pay a small co-pay for generic drugs, but you would pay 50% for brand-name drugs. When the company had paid out \$3,000 for prescription drugs on your behalf in a one-year period, you would have to pay 100% of the drug costs for the rest of that year.

Alternative 2:

The County could keep the policy like it is now, with you paying 25% of the cost of the premium. Beginning 12-01-02, that amount will be NO LESS THAN \$111.80; however, you would have unlimited prescription drug coverage at the same co-pay amounts as active employees.

CONCLUSION

The cost of health care is a major cost for all employers, including Panola County. We hope to continue 100% funding of active employees after 12-01-02, but we will likely have to make some changes in over 65 retirees' coverage or require all retirees to pay a portion of their coverage.

REMEMBER: No such changes as these will occur prior to 12-01-02.


