The Panola County Commissioners' Court offers no objection to the location on the right-of-way of your proposed 1.2 mile 2" water main and 6-3/4" service line as shown by accompanying drawings and notice except as noted below:

It is expressly understood that the County Commissioners' Court does not purpose hereby, to grant any right, claim, title or easement in or upon this county road. It is further understood that in the future should for any reason the county need to work, improve, relocate, widen, increase, add to, or in any manner change the structure of this right-of-way, any required relocation of said lines shall be at the sole expense of owner.

All work on the county right-of-way shall be performed in accordance with the county instructions. The installations shall not damage any part of the road and adequate provisions must be made to cause minimum inconvenience to traffic and adjacent owners. Special specifications for placing this line are as follows:

1. All lines are to be installed a minimum of 36 inches below the flow line of the adjacent drainage or barrow ditch.
2. All excavation within the right-of-way and not under surfacing shall be backfilled by tamping in 6 inch horizontal layers. All surplus material shall be removed from the right-of-way and the excavation finished flush with surrounding natural ground.
3. Lines crossing under surfaced roads and under surfacing cross roads within the right-of-way shall be placed by boring. Boring shall extend from crown line to crown line. Gravity from sewer lines under roadways shall be cast iron pipe.
4. All lines, where practicable, shall be located to cross roadbed at approximately right angles thereto. No lines are to be installed under or within 50 feet of either end of any bridge. No lines shall be placed in any culvert or within 10 feet of the closest point of same.

5. Parallel line will be installed as near the right-of-way lines as is possible and no parallel line will be installed in the roadbed or between the drainage ditch and the roadbed without special permission of the Panola County Commissioners' Court.
6. Operations along roadbeds shall be performed in such manner that all excavated material be kept off the pavement at all times, as well as all operating equipment and materials. 7. Barricades, warning signs, lights, and flag man(men) when necessary shall be provided by the contractor or owner. One-half (1/2) of the traveled portion of the road must be open at all times.

2. All excavation within the right-of-way and not under surfacing shall be backfilled by tamping in 6 inch horizontal layers. All surplus material shall be removed from the right-of-way and the excavation finished flush with surrounding natural ground.
3. Lines crossing under surfaced roads and under surfacing cross roads within the right-of-way shall be placed by boring. Boring shall extend from crown line to crown line. Gravity from sewer lines under roadways shall be cast iron pipe.





TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said premises, together with all and singular the rights, privileges, and appurtenances thereto in any manner belonging unto the said grantee(s), their heirs and assigns forever, so that neither grantor, nor any other taxing unit interested in said tax foreclosure judgment, nor any person claiming under it and them, shall at any time hereafter have, claim or demand any right or title to the aforesaid premises or appurtenances, or any part thereof.

SUBJECT however to the following covenant, condition and restrictions:

- (a) The above described realty, or any part thereof, shall not be used in the operation of, or in conjunction with, any school or other institution of learning, study or instruction which discriminates against any person because of his race, color or national origin, regardless of whether such discrimination be effected by design or otherwise.
- (b) The above described realty, or any part thereof, shall not be used in the operation of, or in conjunction with, any school or other institution of learning, study or instruction which creates, maintains, reinforces, renews, or encourages, or which tends to create, maintain, reinforce, renews or encourage a dual school system.

These restrictions and conditions shall be binding upon grantee and grantee's successors, assigns, heirs and personal representatives for a period of fifty (50) years from the date hereof.

The foregoing restrictions and the other covenants hereafter set out are covenants running with the land, and each and every parcel thereof, and shall be fully binding upon any person, firm, partnership, corporation, trust, church, club, governmental body, or other organization or entity whatever (whether private or governmental in nature), without limitation hereinafter acquiring any estate, title, interest or property in said land, whether by descent, devise, purchase or otherwise; and no act or omission upon the part of grantor herein, its successors and assigns, shall be a waiver of the operation or enforcement of such restrictions; but neither restriction shall be construed to be a condition subsequent or special limitation on the estate thereby conveyed.

It is further covenanted, that third party beneficiaries of the restrictions set forth above shall be as follows:

- (1) As to the restrictions set out in (a) above, any person prejudiced by its violation;
- (2) As to the restriction set out in (b) above, any public school district or any person prejudiced by its violation; and
- (3) As to either or both of the restriction set out in (a) and (b) above, the United States of America, as plaintiff, and the America G.I. Forum, the League of United Latin American Citizens (LULAC), and the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP), as intervenors, in U.S. v. Texas, Civil Action No. 5281, Tyler Division, U.S. District County, Eastern District of Texas; reported in U.S. v. Texas, 321 F. Supp. 1043 (E.D. Tex. 1970); U.S. v. Texas, 330 F. Supp. 235 (E.D. Tex. 1971); aff'd with modifications sub. nom. U.S. v. State of Texas and J. W. Edgar, et al., 447 F2d 441 (5 Cir. 1971); stay den. sub. nom. Edgar v. U.S., 404 U.S. 1206 (1971); cert den. 404 U.S. 1016 (1972).

It is further covenanted that in case of violation of either or both of the above restrictions, any of the third party beneficiaries above alluded to is authorized and empowered to prosecute proceedings at law or in equity against any person, firm, partnership, corporation, trust, church, club, governmental body or other organization or entity whatever (whether private or governmental in nature), without limitation:

- (A) To enforce either or both of such restrictions relating to the use of the above-described realty;
- (B) To abate or prevent violations of either or both of such restrictions; and
- (C) To recover damages for a breach of either or both such restrictions.

It is further covenanted, that is any third party beneficiary referred to above shall prosecute proceedings at law or in equity for the aforesaid purposes, such third party beneficiary may recover reasonable attorney's fees from the violator or violators of either or both of such restrictions, of the Court finds that the proceedings were necessary to bring about compliance therewith.

Taxes for the present year are to be paid by grantee(s) herein.

This deed is given expressly subject to recorded restrictive covenants running with the land, and valid easements of record as of the date of this sale, if such covenants or easements were recorded prior to January 1 of the year the tax lien(s) arose.

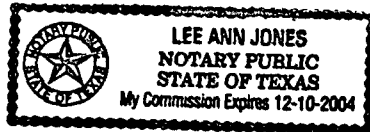





INTERAGENCY AGREEMENT

STATE OF TEXAS, County of Panola

This agreement is entered into by and between the Counties of Rusk and Panola, political subdivisions of the State of Texas, hereinafter referred to "County", and the Cities of Henderson and Carthage, municipal corporations, situated in Rusk and Panola Counties, Texas, hereinafter called "City", pursuant to Chapter 791 of the Texas Government Code, concerning interlocal cooperation contracts.

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, The Counties of Panola and Rusk and the Cities of Henderson and Carthage grant application with Criminal Justice Division of the Office of the Governor, State of Texas, for funding in the amount of \$341,271.00 for Northeast Texas Narcotics Task Force, and WHEREAS, the Counties of Panola and Rusk and the Cities of Henderson and Carthage have agreed to contribute the total of \$ 5,000.00 in matching funds if said joint application is approved; and

WHEREAS, the source of funds would not normally be used for this purpose; and WHEREAS, the Counties of Panola and Rusk and the Cities of Henderson and Carthage in their best interests to join in the application to develop a Northeast Texas Narcotics Task Force; and WHEREAS, the Counties of Panola and Rusk and the Cities of Henderson and Carthage agree to each accept the responsibility to adhere to all pertinent Federal, State and local laws or regulations.

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

ARTICLE I

PURPOSE

1.01 The purpose of the Agreement is to allow the Counties of Panola and Rusk and the Cities of Henderson and Carthage to file a joint application for a Grant with the Criminal Justice Division, which creates the Northeast Texas Narcotics Task Force, which application is attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and made a part hereof for all purposes.

ARTICLE II

TERM

2.01 The term of this agreement is to commence on the execution of this Agreement and to end May 31, 2004.

ARTICLE III

CONSIDERATION

3.01 As consideration for this agreement, the Counties of Panola and Rusk and the Cities of Henderson and Carthage agree to contribute a total of \$ 5,000.00 in matching funds for the enhancement of the Northeast Texas Narcotics Task Force in the amounts as follows:

PROGRAM INCOME: \$ 237,576.00
 CITY OF CARTHAGE: 5,000.00
 CITY OF HENDERSON: 5,000.00
 COUNTY OF PANOLA: 5,000.00
 COUNTY OF RUSK: 5,000.00

ARTICLE IV

ALLOCATION OF FUNDS

4.01 The specific allocation of the Funds is set out in the attachments to the agreement, marked as Exhibits "A" through "E" inclusive, and made a part hereof for all purposes.

ARTICLE V

OWNERSHIP OF EQUIPMENT

5.01 Upon termination of this agreement, ownership of equipment, hardware and other nonexpendable items will revert to the applicant for which it was acquired, subject to the approval of the Criminal Justice Division of the Governor's Office.

ARTICLE VI

AMENDMENTS

6.01 This agreement may be amended by the mutual agreement of the parties hereto in writing to be attached to and incorporated into this agreement.

ARTICLE VII

LEGAL CONSTRUCTION

7.01 In case any one or more of the provisions contained in this agreement shall be held to be invalid, illegal or unenforceable in any respect such an invalidity, illegality or unenforceability shall not affect any other provision thereof, and this agreement shall be construed as if such invalid, illegal or unenforceable provision had never been contained herein.


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ARTICLE VIII

REPORT OF ROAD SUPERINTENDENT

OCTOBER, 2002


November 4, 2002

1. No money has been taken into the road fund by the undersigned.
2. During the month the department received 8 calls for service with 7 requests completed. The remainder will be completed as time and weather permits.
3. A test was conducted of the emergency generators at the Department in the event of a power failure. The generators were able to supply power to the building, including phone, radio service and all fuel pumps.
4. Due to the wet weather, mowing operations were discontinued. Tractor operators were reassigned to precinct duties. Brush axes, however, will continue to operate through the year.
5. The Department transported approximately 8,000 cubic yards of RAP from a TXDOT stockpile on U.S. Highway 59 to the warehouse. The material will be used to feed the cold mix plant next spring.
6. The majority of Panola County roads remain in good condition with precinct crews conducting maintenance, drainage, and patching operations.
7. Nothing further to report.
