To whom it may concern,

Beginning in 2011 the impoundment facility for the city of Carthage and Panola County has been located at Carthage Veterinary Hospital and has been under the advisement of Dr. Dean R. Yates. In the beginning, it was intended to be a holding facility for the city and county for stray animals to be held for 10 days, then humanely euthanized; with little focus on adopting out animals. Currently it still serves this purpose however, it has transitioned into increased success with adoptions and rescues. During the eight years that the impoundment facility has been located at Carthage Veterinary Hospital, the annual cost of care for the animals has increased year-to-year. More animals are reclaimed due to the efforts of our staff in posting animals' information on the Carthage Panola County Pound Facebook page. All animals are dewormed upon intake, as well as vaccinated if aged 10 months or younger in an effort to reduce parvo and other disease outbreaks. All animals are also evaluated for health & well-being; as well as for disease or injury. Annual dispositions for 2016, 2017, 2018, and year-to-date (September) 2019 are as follows:

In addition to the daily maintenance that the pound requires, there are also many other associated costs. These costs include but are not limited to salary for kennel technicians to clean seven days a week, drug costs (dewormer, etc.),

vaccination costs, run/cage upkeep, floor sealant, disinfectant products (bleach, Kennelsol, etc.), cell phone/camera usage for Facebook page upkeep, printer/ink/paper for photo identification for cages, controlled drug costs (actual drug purchases & DEA CD licensing), filling records requests, and general utility costs (water, lights, fans, AC/Heater). All have increased over the years and continue to increase. Also, a valuable service that Carthage Veterinary Hospital staff provides, is public relations which helps with the public's perception of the impoundment facility. The perception of the impoundment facility has become more positive in recent years, due to our success of placing animals out to adopters and rescue groups. Due to the rising costs of keeping the impoundment facility at the current level of care and to continue to provide the best care for the strays of Panola County and the City of Carthage, an increase to \$ 12,500.00 is respectfully requested, as well as two large chest freezers for holding of the deceased remains and a refrigerator to place in the pound for deceased specimens to be sent off for testing and/or wet/canned dog and/or cat food.
