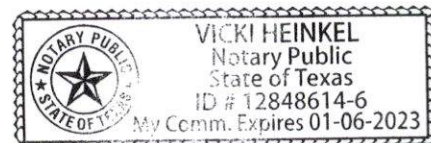

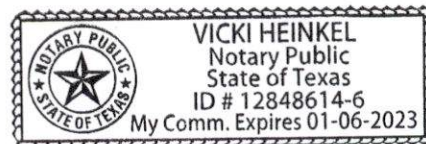

It is expressly understood that the County Commissioners' Court does not purpose hereby, to grant any right, claim, title or easement in or upon this county road. It is further understood that in the future should for any reason the county need to work, improve, relocate, widen, increase, add to, or in any manner change the structure of this right-of-way, any required relocation of said lines shall be at the sole expense of owner.

All work on the county right-of-way shall be performed in accordance with the county instructions. The installations shall not damage any part of the road and adequate provisions must be made to cause minimum inconvenience to traffic and adjacent owners. Special specifications for placing this line are as follows:

1. All lines are to be installed a minimum of 36 inches below the flow line of the adjacent drainage or barrow ditch.
2. All excavation within the right-of-way and not under surfacing shall be backfilled by tamping in 6 inch horizontal layers. All surplus material shall be removed from the right-of-way and the excavation finished flush with surrounding natural ground.
3. Lines crossing under surfaced roads and under surfacing cross roads within the right-of-way shall be placed by boring. Boring shall extend from crown line to crown line. Gravity from sewer lines under roadways shall be cast iron pipe.
4. All lines, where practicable, shall be located to cross roadbed at approximately right angles thereto. No lines are to be installed under or within 50 feet of either end of any bridge. No lines shall be placed in any culvert or within 10 feet of the closest point of same.



5. Parallel line will be installed as near the right-of-way lines as is possible and no parallel line will be installed in the roadbed or between the drainage ditch and the roadbed without special permission of the Panola County Commissioners' Court.
6. Operations along roadbeds shall be performed in such manner that all excavated material be kept off the pavement at all times, as well as all operating equipment and materials. 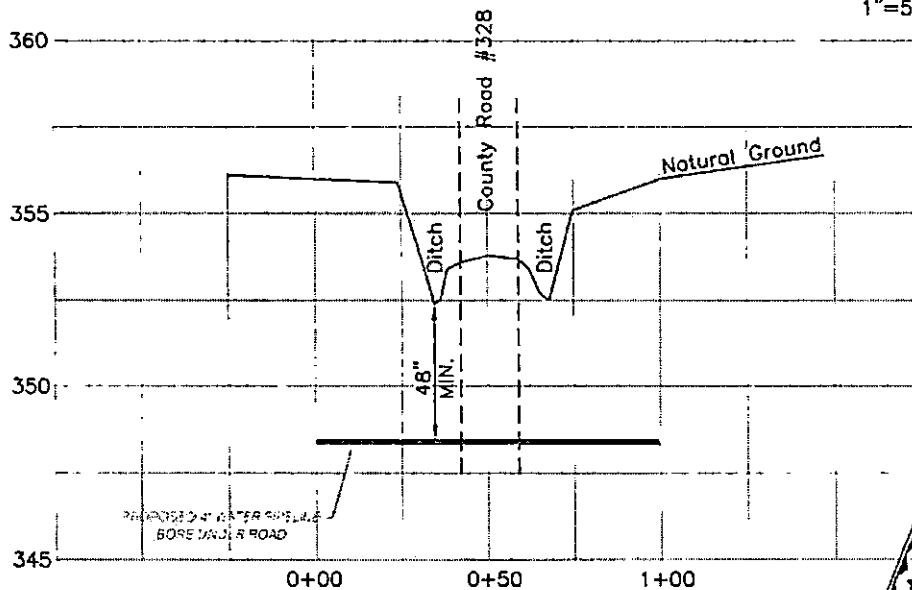

  - Devices with the triangle symbol may be omitted when stated elsewhere in the plans, or for routine maintenance work, when approved by the Engineer.
  - Inactive work vehicles or other equipment should be parked near the work area.
  - A shadow vehicle with a TMA should be used on a highway if it can be positioned 30 to 100 feet in advance of the area of exposure without adversely affecting the performance or quality of the work. If workers are no longer present but road or work conditions require the traffic control to remain in place, Type B or C cones should be used to channelize the traffic.
  - Additional shadow vehicles with TMA's may be positioned off the paved surface, next to those shown in order to protect wider work spaces.

# GRUMBLE STRIPS FOR LANE CLOSURE ON CONVENTIONAL ROADWAY

## GENERAL NOTES

1. Each Rubble Strip Array should consist of three rubble strips spaced center to center at the spacing shown in Table 2, placed transverse across the lane at locations shown.
2. The CW17-2T "RUMBLE STRIPS AHEAD" sign should be located after the CW20-10 "ROAD MARK AHEAD" sign and spaced as shown. If traffic is observed to be queuing beyond the Rubble Strips, the CW17-2T sign and the first Rubble Strip Array may be located upstream of the CW20-10 sign as necessary to provide needed warning.
3. Temporary Rubble Strips will be considered subsidiary to Item 502, and shall be a product listed on the Compliant Mark Zone Traffic Control Devices.
4. Removal of the Temporary Rubble Strips should be accomplished before removing the advance warning signs.
5. Temporary Rubble Strips should not be used on horizontal curves, loose gravel, salt or bleeding asphalt, heavily rutted pavements or unpaved surfaces.
6. Temporary Rubble Strips shall be installed in accordance with the manufacturer's recommendations.
7. This standard sheet shall be used in conjunction with other appropriate TCE standard, MUTCD typical application or project specific detail for the project.
8. The one-lane two-way application may utilize a flagger, an ADAP or a portable traffic signal.
9. Temporary Rubble Strips may be used on freeways or expressways based on engineering judgment.






