

PANOLA COUNTY BROADBAND PROJECT PHASES


- Panola County is addressing critical broadband connectivity needs through its partnership with the East Texas Regional Broadband Initiative with ETCOG.
- Completion of the two phases will address major broadband gaps in Panola County but not be a total solution to the broadband needs.


PHASE 1

PHASE 1 SUMMARY

- A broadband action plan for Panola County has been developed in partnership with the East Texas Council of Governments (ETCOG).
- County officials, stakeholders, and interested parties in Panola County have provided input, comments, and information to support the work.
- Grant funding from EDA: \$375,000
 Local match: \$161,000 (shared by 14 counties & EDCs)
- No local funding is needed at this time for Phase 1 projects

- The Panola County project identification team has been led by former County Judge David Anderson.
- Each county's project identification team differs. Teams typically include county and city officials, Economic Development Corporation representatives, and Internet Service Providers.
- Teams meet as many times as needed to complete the identification of three to five most important broadband development projects for each county.
- One of the identified projects can address residential broadband as long as telework is enhanced.

The team identified six projects for underserved businesses, with one project also serving residential telework.

Carthage Infrastructure Update

To provide high speed internet to existing businesses & attract new **business** to developing business park. (Middle Mile)

Gary Expansion

To provide high speed fiber internet for new and underserved **businesses** and residences along this route towards Gary City. (Last Mile)

E. Panola County & Business Park Expansion

To provide high speed internet to existing businesses & attract new **business** to developing business park.(Last Mile)

Fairplay Extension

To provide high speed fiber internet for new and underserved **businesses** and residences along this route towards the Fairplay community. (Last Mile)

Murvaul Broadband Extension

To provide high speed internet service to un/underserved new and existing homebased businesses and full-time and part-time telecommuters. (Last Mile)


DeBerry Expansion


To provide high speed fiber internet for new and underserved **businesses** and residences along this route towards the residences along this route towards DeBerry. (Last Mile)

\$16,639,889 is estimated to be needed for project implementation.








REGIONAL MIDDLE MILE NETWORK


- Four (4) segments are proposed for Panola County.
- Network will ensure all 14 East Texas counties have a foundation for full regional connectivity.
- Middle Mile network is designed to allow access to new and existing ISPs to complete last mile service to homes or businesses.
- The network will help close the gap with urban areas (Dallas / Houston).


