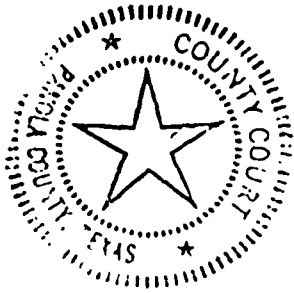

There were no comments from the citizens in attendance.

The Panola County Commissioners' Court offers no objection to the location on the right-of-way of your proposed 4" line as shown by accompanying drawings and notice except as noted below.

It is expressly understood that the County Commissioners' Court does not purpose hereby, to grant any right, claim, title or easement in or upon this county road. It is further understood that in the future should for any reason the county need to work, improve, relocate, widen, increase, add to, or in any manner change the structure of this right-of-way, any required relocation of said lines shall be at the sole expense of owner.

All work on the county right-of-way shall be performed in accordance with the county instructions. The installations shall not damage any part of the road and adequate provisions must be made to cause minimum inconvenience to traffic and adjacent owners. Special specifications for placing this line are as follows:

1. All lines are to be installed a minimum of 36 inches below the flow line of the adjacent drainage or barrow ditch.
2. All excavation within the right-of-way and not under surfacing shall be backfilled by tamping in 6 inch horizontal layers. All surplus material shall be removed from the right-of-way and the excavation finished flush with surrounding natural ground.
3. Lines crossing under surfaced roads and under surfacing cross roads within the right-of-way shall be placed by boring. Boring shall extend from crown line to crown line. Gravity from sewer lines under roadways shall be cast iron pipe.
4. All lines, where practicable, shall be located to cross roadbed at approximately right angles thereto. No lines are to be installed under or within 50 feet of either end of any bridge. No lines shall be placed in any culvert or within 10 feet of the closest point of same.

5. Parallel line will be installed as near the right-of-way lines as is possible and no parallel line will be installed in the roadbed or between the drainage ditch and the roadbed without special permission of the Panola County Commissioners' Court.
6. Operations along roadbeds shall be performed in such manner that all excavated material be kept off the pavement at all times, as well as all operating equipment and materials. No equipment or installation procedures will be used which will damage any road surface or structures. The cost of any repairs to road surface, roadbed, structures or other right-of-way features as a direct result of this installation will be borne by the owner of this line.
7. Barricades, warning signs, lights, and flag man(men) when necessary shall be provided by the contractor or owner. One-half (1/2) of the traveled portion of the road must be open at all times.

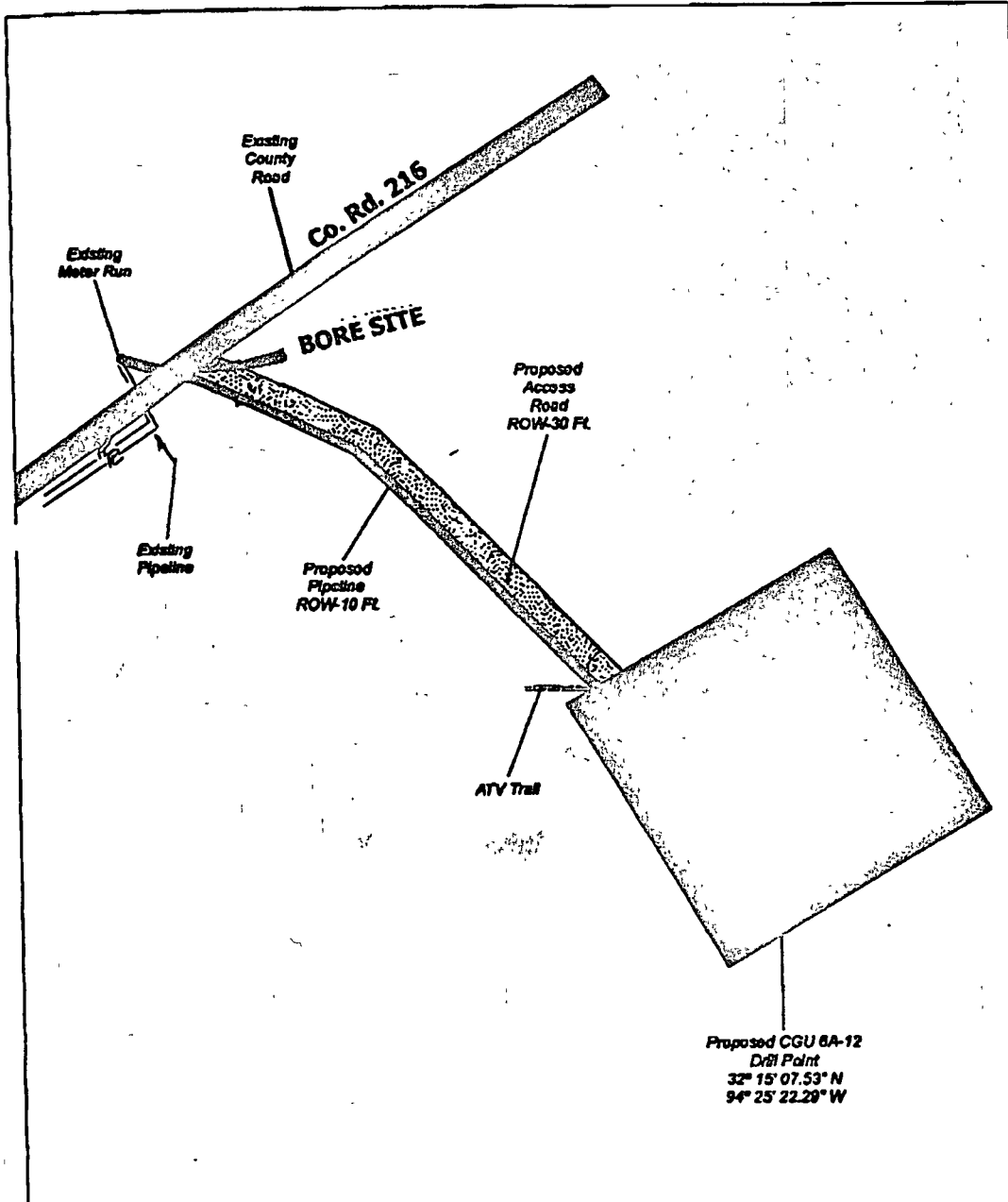


	Figure 2 Site Plan of the Proposed CGU 6A-12 Well Site, Access Road, and Pipeline Locations in Panola County, TX

**SPECIAL SPECIFICATIONS
FOR PIPE LINES CROSSING IN BORED HOLES
AND PLACED PARALLEL TO COUNTY ROADS**

GENERAL NOTE: The construction of this project shall follow "The Panola County Road and Bridge Department Standard Specifications" with respect To barricades, flagmen, flares, warning signs, and all responsibility for complaints or damage suits by traveling public and adjacent property owners.

1. Exaction material shall not be placed on road shoulders or traffic lanes or in ditches where drainage would be impaired. When excavation is permitted near the roadway where, in the opinion of the County, the support of the oil road structure is endangered, sheeting, cribbing, other measures shall be taken to prevent damage to the roadway or the creation of traffic hazard.
2. All excavations shall be backfilled in a neat and workmanlike manner and all disturbed areas shall be restored to a condition comparable to the original condition. Backfill material shall be consolidated to a density comparable to that of the adjacent undisturbed material, replacing all of the excavated material except that displaced by pipe. The degree of compaction shall be such as to prevent future settlement. Excess material displaced by the pipe shall be remove from the right-of-way or otherwise disposed of to the satisfaction of the county's representative. Pipe laying operation shall not be carried on when soil conditions are such that construction equipment will cause rutting. Backfill operations shall be kept within one mile of trenching and/or pipe laying operations.
3. Sod and/or other erosion control measures removed or disturbed by the installation shall be replaced. This shall include keeping separate and replacing existing topsoil, importing sod or seeding or a combination of these methods together with fertilizer and water as necessary to re-establish vegetative cover in a healthy and growing condition.
4. The pipe or, if encased, the encasement pipe shall completely fit the bored hole.
5. All private and commercial access driveways disturbed by pipe laying shall be restored to a condition comparable to that which existed prior to these operation. Special care shall be taken to compact backfill and base material to prevent future settlement. All work shall be completed to the owners satisfaction. All public access driveways with paved surfaces shall be crossed by the bored hole method. Crossings of dirt or gravel public access driveways may be made as specified for private and commercial access driveways except that provisions shall be made for uninterrupted flow of traffic.

6. No trees or shrubbery shall be cut or trimmed with the approval of the Panola County Road and Bridge Department.
7. Regulations and ordinances of incorporated cities shall be complied with if with the city limits.

Transfers.** Before the undersigned law enforcement agency transfers cash, property, or proceeds to other state or local law enforcement agencies, it must verify first that the receiving agency has a current and valid Federal Equitable Sharing Agreement on file with both the Department of Justice and the Department of the Treasury. If there is no agreement on file, the undersigned law enforcement agency must obtain one from the receiving agency and forward it to the Department of Justice and the Department of the Treasury as in item 1. 5. Internal Controls. The parties agree to account separately for federal equitable sharing funds received from the Department of Justice and the Department of the Treasury. Funds from state and local forfeitures and other sources must not be commingled with federal equitable sharing funds. The recipient agency shall establish a separate revenue account or accounting code for state, local, Department of Justice, and Department of the Treasury forfeiture funds. Interest income generated must be accounted for in the appropriate federal forfeiture fund account.

The parties agree that such accounting will be subject to the standard accounting requirements and practices employed for other public monies as supplemented by requirements set forth in the current edition of the Department of Justice's *A Guide to Equitable Sharing of Federally Forfeited Property for State and Local Law Enforcement Agencies (Justice Guide)*, and the Department of the Treasury's *Guide to Equitable Sharing for Foreign Countries and Federal, State, and Local Law Enforcement Agencies (Treasury Guide)*. The accounting of shared funds must be reported on the Annual Certification Report.

The misuse or misapplication of shared resources or the supplantation of existing resources with shared assets is prohibited. Failure to comply with any provision of this agreement shall subject the recipient agency to the sanctions stipulated in the current edition of the *Justice or Treasury Guides*, depending on the source of the funds or property.

6. Federal Annual Certification Report. The recipient agency shall submit an Annual Certification Report to the Department of Justice and the Department of the Treasury (at the addresses shown in item 1) and a copy to the U.S. Attorney in the district in which the recipient agency is located. The certification must be submitted in accordance with the instructions received from the respective departments or as outlined in the *Justice or Treasury Guides*. Receipt of the certification report is a prerequisite to receiving any equitably shared cash, property, or proceeds.

7. Audit Report. Audits will be conducted as provided by the Single Audit Act Amendments of 1996 and OMB Circular A-133. The Department of Justice and the Department of the Treasury reserve the right to conduct periodic random audits.

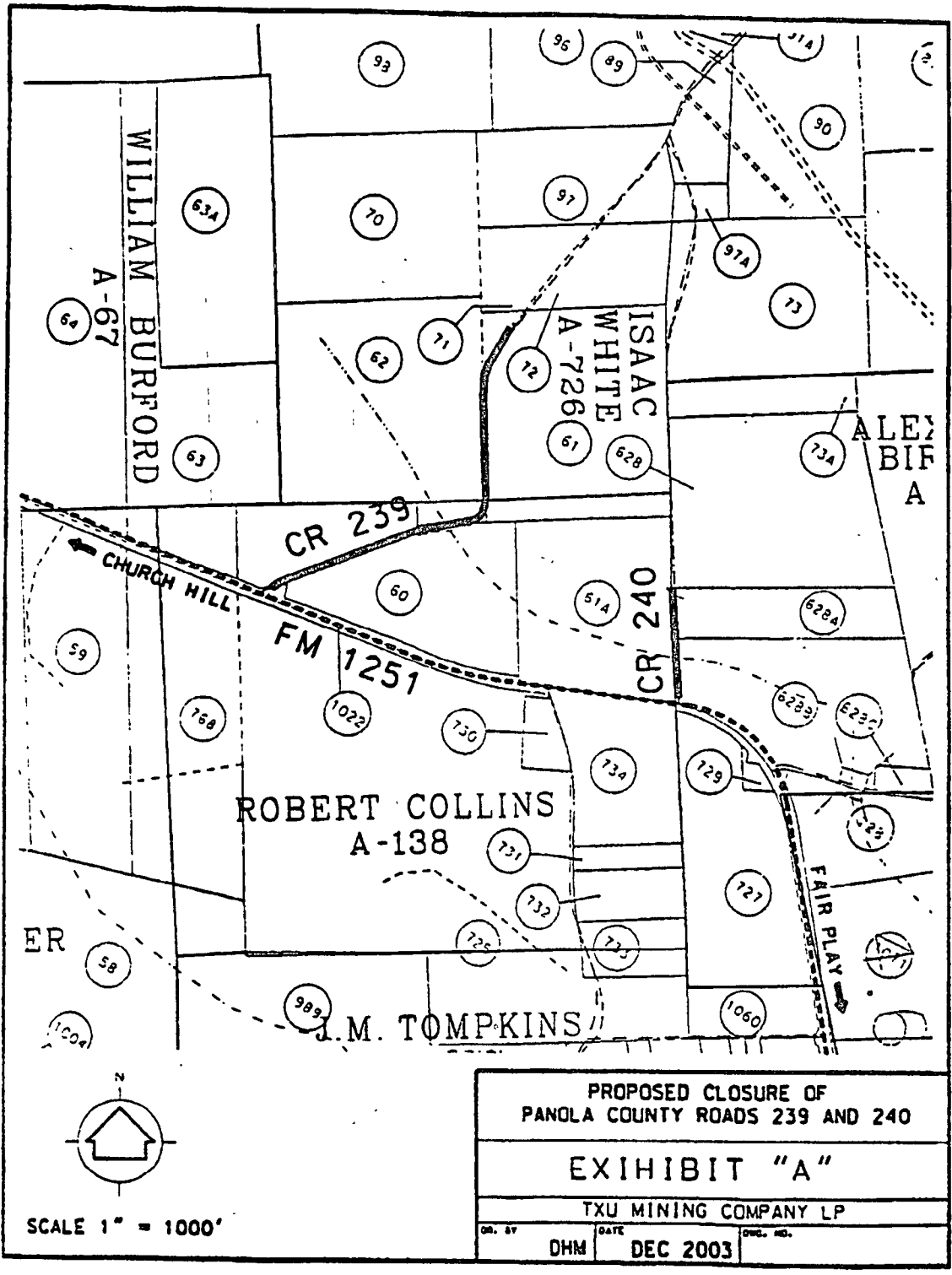

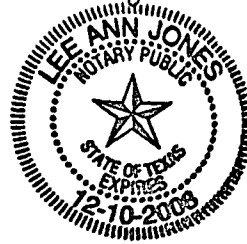

The 123rd Judicial District, population 48,488 (Panola and Shelby Counties) is located 175 miles northeast of Houston, Texas, on a drug trafficking corridor that follows US Highway 59 North. Highway 59 North is connected to Interstate 20 and Interstate 30. Prison overcrowding, community supervision, drug dependency treatment and judicial intervention has not reduced recidivism rates among dependent drug offenders. Crack Cocaine was once the drug users preference in the 123rd Judicial District. In past years the 123rd Judicial District's most often abused drug was "crack" cocaine. This drug has proven to be extremely addictive. The 123rd Judicial District is currently facing a new drug epidemic, methamphetamine. The North Texas Narcotics Task Force stated, during a recent seminar, that methamphetamine has become the most abused drug in their district. Methamphetamine abusers have a 24 hour "high", compared to a crack cocaine "high" of a few hours. The North Texas Narcotics Task Force considers methamphetamine more addictive than "crack" cocaine. A program that offers stringent supervision and counseling needed. The Drug Court program would offer the judges in our district an opportunity to punish and rehabilitate non-violent drug offenders in a closely monitored setting. Review of the literature on drug court successes in these areas convinced the courts of the need for a drug court, we are in the beginning phases, so application is being made for continuing assistance through the LLEBG-Rural Drug Court Initiative(CFDA-16.18.592).

The volume of arrests in the 123rd Judicial District is an indicator of the need for a program like drug court. In FY 2004 of the 1815 arrests in Panola County 192 were Drug related, 112 were Driving While Intoxicated. The same time period 1571 arrests were made in Shelby County 157 were Drug related 120 were Driving While Intoxicated. The statistics were compiled by the Shelby and Panola County Sheriff's Departments. It is estimated that 50% (174) of the drug related offenses would be eligible for community supervision and 70% (162) of the DWI's would be eligible for community supervision. Due to the careful screening process it is estimated that 20% (67) would have been eligible for the Drug Court program. The CSCD provides quality gender-specific supportive outpatient substance abuse counseling, cognitive behavior services through an in house program, while making referral for co-occurring problem Substance dependent probationers (target population for drug court) are referred to East Texas Council on Alcohol and Drug Abuse (ETCADA) or Alcohol Drug Abuse Council (ADAC). In 2004, there was an average 2-4 week delay between evaluation and entry into a treatment program. Currently the average delay is 6-12 weeks for entry into a treatment program. Officers understand the importance of a treatment team approach to supervision, but high case loads preclude this option. The current judicial case processing system does not allow for court settings to celebrate successes in supervision, probationers receive only negative feedback and negative consequences for failures. The Drug Court will use a Management Information System by the name of Buffalo. This system was designed by the Buffalo, New York and Jacksonville, Florida Drug Courts. Buffalo addresses all concerns of the Drug Court. Also, demographics of the arrestee population will be monitored. An online report will be incorporated into the Management Information System (MIS), allowing drug court staff to monitor the race, ethnicity, age, and gender composition of drug court participants, versus the arrestee populations at the time admissions are made. In the event bias is uncovered, CSCD will re-evaluate the screening process, improving or changing the instruments as needed and providing technical or diversity training for personnel.

The Drug Court uses behavior modification techniques along with intensive supervision to help offenders make a positive change. Offenders will have mandatory individual and group counseling. Offenders will also be subjected to GED or technical training classes if necessary to maintain employment. Full time employment by offenders could lead to a vocational skill. Offenders will have classes in cognitive thinking and have goals, rewards or sanctions as needed. For the first time in their lives, offenders will have a set of rules set out before them and a team of professionals to make sure that they are enforced and reinforced. Offenders will have the support and the boundaries to lead a drug free and productive life, free of criminal behavior. This program is the alternative for offenders who want a positive change in their lives.

The goal of this project is to reduce offender recidivism in our communities by implementing an intensive drug court program. Our goal is to keep offenders drug and alcohol free, reduce recidivism and maintain a substance-free lifestyle through a non-adversarial court approach. A 50% drop in substance abuse is anticipated, as measured by intoxilyzer/urine screen results. We project criminal activity will be lowered by 30% up to three years after completion, as measured by criminal history record checks. Assessment scores are expected to show a 20% improvement in social functioning, employment stability, educational attainment, relationship stability, amenability to treatment, and self-satisfaction. Drug court participants will enter treatment 50% faster than other probationers. Outcomes will be measured through a comprehensive drug court and outcome evaluation. Goals to meet: Members of the Shelby County Drug Court Team have been hired. The Panola County Drug Court Team is one member short of being complete, but interviews are being held. Formal training for both Drug Court Teams is ongoing. The 123rd Judicial District Adult Drug Court offers many services. An inpatient/residential substance abuse treatment facility is available to participants. Available facilities include, (1) TAIP, (2) SAFFP or (3) halfway house. These facilities would offer the tools and techniques to avoid alcohol and drugs. Also, provided is aftercare/relapse prevention through group and individual counseling. Participants will work on individual set goals. Participants will receive individual counseling from a licensed drug court counselor. The counselor also involves family and spouse individual counseling sessions. The Drug Court Counselor will provide a weekly parenting class to participants. Participants will learn to set boundaries, enforce rules and discipline in an appropriate manner, so as to stop the cycle of substance abuse. The drug court also offers group/peer counseling in several settings, the aftercare classes, the drug education classes and the cognitive behavioral modification classes. Another aspect of the program which offers group/peer counseling is the NAA program which drug court sponsors. There are two classes per week for participants and any other probationer with drug or alcohol problems. The drug court also offers mental health/individual diagnosis services through the Burke Center in Nacogdoches, Texas. The program also offers assistance/referrals with health care. The Drug Court has agreements with local physicians, to provide low cost health care. The Drug Court provides educational pamphlets and flyers to participants concerning health problems associated with drug and alcohol abuse. Local churches have also agreed to give classes on life skills and an invitation to services for spiritual support. While these classes are made available to clients they are not mandatory. The Drug Court program works with Panola College to offer basic adult education, GED assistance, technical training, and job training. The Texas Workforce Commission accepts referrals for employment opportunities. These are the services offered to Drug Court participants.
