The Panola County Commissioners' Court offers no objection to the location on the right-of-way of your proposed **6" steel natural gas pipe** line as shown by accompanying drawings and notice except as noted below.

It is expressly understood that the County Commissioners' Court does not purpose hereby, to grant any right, claim, title or easement in or upon this county road. It is further understood that in the future should for any reason the county need to work, improve, relocate, widen, increase, add to, or in any manner change the structure of this right-of-way, any required relocation of said lines shall be at the sole expense of owner

All work on the county right-of-way shall be performed in accordance with the county instructions. The installations shall not damage any part of the road and adequate provisions must be made to cause minimum inconvenience to traffic and adjacent owners. Special specifications for placing this line are as follows:

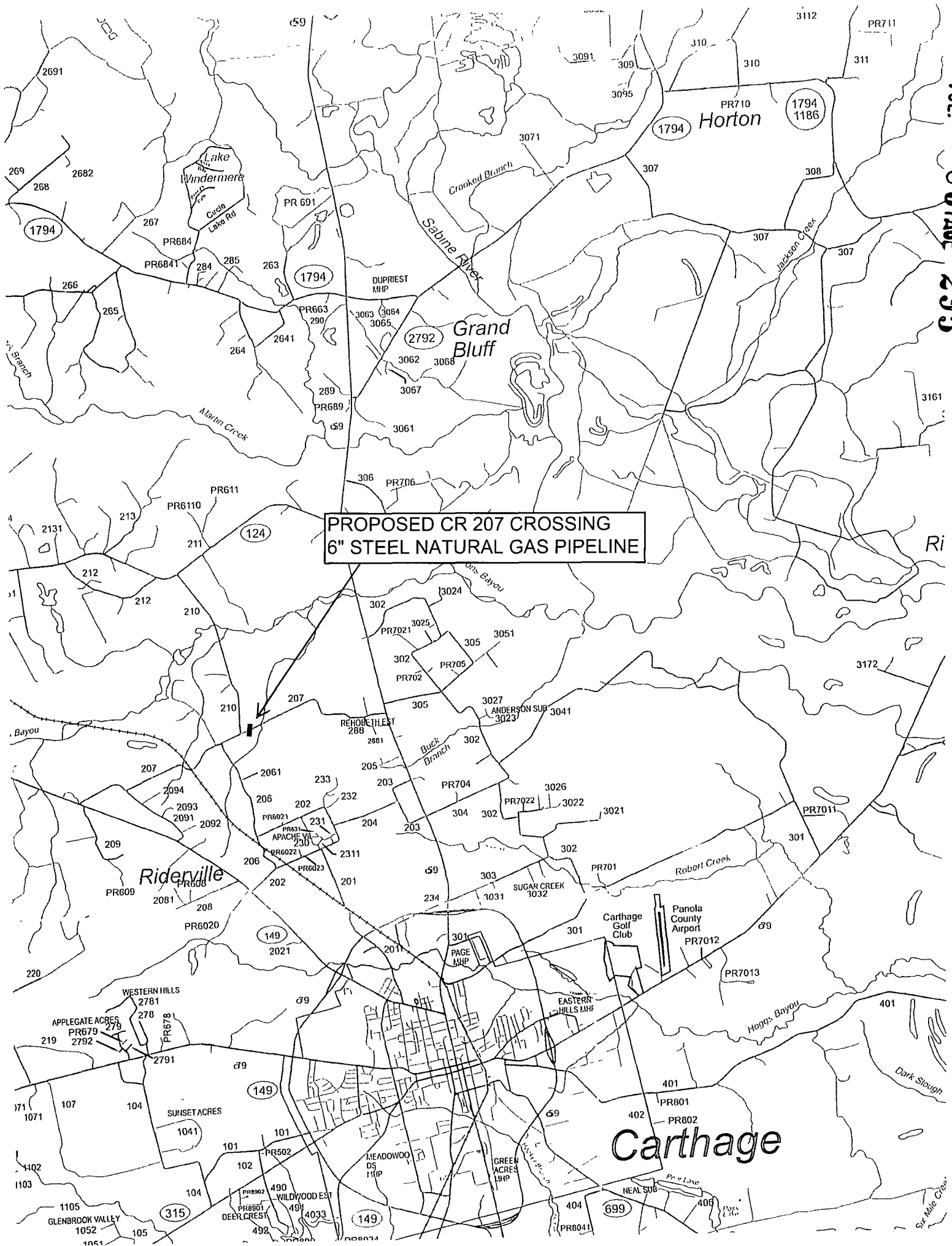
1. All lines are to be installed a minimum of 36 inches below the flow line of the adjacent drainage or barrow ditch.
2. All excavation within the right-of-way and not under surfacing shall be backfilled by tamping in 6 inch horizontal layers. All surplus material shall be removed from the right-of-way and the excavation finished flush with surrounding natural ground
3. Lines crossing under surfaced roads and under surfacing cross roads within the right-of-way shall be placed by boring. Boring shall extend from crown line to crown line. Gravity from sewer lines under roadways shall be cast iron pipe.
4. All lines, where practicable, shall be located to cross roadbed at approximately right angles thereto. No lines are to be installed under or within 50 feet of either end of any bridge. No lines shall be placed in any culvert or within 10 feet of the closest point of same.

5. Parallel line will be installed as near the right-of-way lines as is possible and no parallel line will be installed in the roadbed or between the drainage ditch and the roadbed without special permission of the Panola County Commissioners' Court.
6. Operations along roadbeds shall be performed in such manner that all excavated material be kept off the pavement at all times, as well as all operating equipment and materials. No equipment or installation procedures will be used which will damage any road surface or structures. The cost of any repairs to road surface, roadbed, structures or other right-of-way features as a direct result of this installation will be borne by the owner of this line.
7. Barricades, warning signs, lights, and flag man(men) when necessary shall be provided by the contractor or owner. One-half (1/2) of the traveled portion of the road must be open at all times.



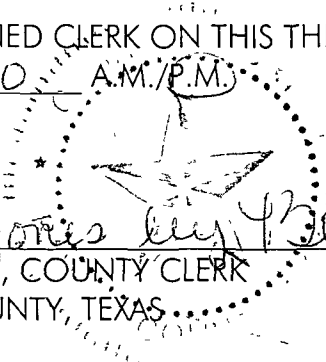



#### Ten Essential Characteristics

**Integration of Services** - The integration between alcohol and other drug treatment services in the processing of cases in the judicial system.

The integration between alcohol and other drug treatment services in the processing of cases in the judicial system. While in drug court, a defendant has access to several different meeting places which are designed to accommodate different types of addiction. Alcoholics have different needs from those who strictly abuse prescription or illegal drugs and of course there are those individuals who are reliant on both alcohol and drugs. We use AA to help those cope with being an alcoholic and we use NA to help those who suffer from a more substance related addiction. There are also non-formal meeting places where some offenders feel more relaxed but still have a positive atmosphere conducive to sobriety. Treatment Centers are located all over Texas with the goal of rehabilitating offenders. While those treatment facilities are usually regarded as a last measure of sanction prior to revocation of probation, they are utilized none the less. Defendants, in most cases, can be admitted in to the Centers and come back with more of a chance at a lasting sobriety.

**Non-Adversarial Approach** – The use of a non-adversarial approach involving prosecutors and defense attorneys to promote public safety and to protect the due process rights of program participants.

There are staffings that are held at the first of the month and various unscheduled times that keep Drug Court team members involved and up to date on probation cases and progress. Defendants are made aware of the fact that they have a Defense lawyer who keeps their best legal interests in mind while also contributing ideas and/or sanctions to the Drug Court staff. Not having the typical District attorney who is usually against or is trying to prosecute the defendant, helps the Defendant feel more comfortable about being honest and up front with all drug court staff members involved. As the Defense attorney, the prosecuting attorney and the Judge get together and hold a staff meeting with the Counselor and Probation officer, it becomes more possible to figure a way to either sanction or show approval toward however a given Defendant is complying.

**Prompt Placement** – Early identification and prompt placement of eligible participants in the program.

Early identification of eligible candidates for Drug Court is important; however it is not always the case due to the some Defendants abilities to camouflage their addiction or deceive their officers. It takes the coordination of everyone involved to identify those eligible individuals. Identification can come from reading through a docket and deciding during plea bargaining or it may come from a probation officer who refers an offender who they feel really needs the extra supervision and / or help. An individual who has numerous possession charges as well as failed Drug Tests throws a red flag for detection so that prompt placement is possible.

**Access** – Access to a continuum of alcohol, drug, and other related treatment and rehabilitative services.

Access to a continuum of Drug and alcohol related services is important for an individual to remain sober and free of drugs after he or she has been discharged from the Drug Court program and more importantly after they have been discharged from probation and are on their own in society.

**Abstinence Monitoring** – Monitoring of abstinence through weekly alcohol and other drug testing.

Monitoring a person's sobriety is not always 100 percent possible due to deceptive probationers. Weekly testing in the early stages of the program is reason enough for an individual to stay sober; however, that obviously does not always happen. Home visits and surprise drug testing are ways to keep probationers guessing and also ways to monitor sobriety. Honesty plays a big part in the program because of the fact that monitoring is not always full-proof. Dishonesty is not tolerated and more strictly sanctioned when discovered.

**Compliance Strategy** – A coordinated strategy to govern program responses to participants' compliance.

It is impossible to know for sure if the program is working because different strategies work for different people. One can review the recidivism rate of those who graduate and speak to family members and friends about that individual in hopes of getting a truthful answer on how they are coping after graduation. Often, a simple arrest report will tell the truth. A coordinated strategy between the district Attorney's investigator and the CSO can be helpful. Sometimes people from the streets will give information on certain individuals who may or may not have been in drug court. This can sometimes tell if a certain person is doing well and staying sober or if he or she is not.

**Judicial Interaction** – Ongoing judicial interaction with program participants

An interaction between the Drug court staff and the Defendant in a formal courtroom setting tends to remind the Defendant that he is still held accountable and still has obligations to fulfill. Seeing the Judge dressed in the black robe triggers a psychological response which tends to keep the Defendants' crime or reason for being in Drug Court fresh in his mind.

**Evaluation** – Monitoring and evaluation of program goals and effectiveness.

Program goals are ultimately sobriety. There are secondary goals such as getting a GED, or obtaining a driver's license. Finding a job is an obtainable goal which helps the others fall in place, so while it is not the primary goal it is usually one that is first on the list. Monitoring effectiveness can be studied by recidivism rates or by staying in touch with individual who have graduated the program. They can advise whether or not the program actually helped them or if they were just successfully deception.

**Education** – Continuing interdisciplinary education to promote effective program planning, implementation, and operations.

Our Drug Court CSO does have to provide ongoing education in the form of different training held throughout the state of Texas. Interdisciplinary education is helpful as it provides different ideas and thinking that would otherwise not be learned and utilized. With the Grants being cut as they have been the past several years, it is difficult and almost impossible to send the Drug Court CSO to actual Drug Court Conferences that are outside of Texas.

**Partnerships** – Development of partnerships with public agencies and community organizations.

Our Drug Court CSO keeps close communication with other public agencies in the county. The City Police Department as well as the Sheriff's Department and CPS try to be as helpful as they can be when it comes to either keeping that extra eye out for certain individuals or providing input and ideas of how to deal with certain individuals and circumstances.

This 123rd Judicial District Adult Drug Court program (which includes Panola & Shelby Counties, 2010 U.S. census population of 49,244) is designed to address the continued substance abuse issues and recidivism rates. Sentences for these offenders still vary from county jail and prison time, specialized community supervision, drug dependency treatment (inpatient/outpatient), and judicial intervention. These alternatives alone have not reduced the recidivism among drug offenders. Drug Abuse continues to escalate in the 123rd Judicial District. The Panola and Shelby county jails and the prison system continue at maximum capacity. The drug trafficking corridor appears to be on the increase also, this includes: US Highway 59, Interstate 20, Interstate 30, and introducing Interstate 49 and the future of US Highway 69, all of which run through or near to both counties, make illegal drugs still readily available. Panola & Shelby counties make up the 123rd Judicial District; each county still has different drug abuse patterns due to their socio-economic status. Shelby County's main drug problem continues to be "crack" cocaine, but now has the uprising use of methamphetamines. Panola County's main drug of problem continues to be methamphetamines. Drug offenders continually abusing drugs, making them a part of their lifestyle, resulting in ongoing criminal activity and re-occurring problems within the communities.

The volume of arrests in the 123rd Judicial District is an indicator of the need for continued intervention, such as the Drug Court Program. In the period from January 2010 to December 2010, there were 1,118 arrests in Panola County, which 90 of those arrests were drug related and 276 were alcohol related. During the same time period, Shelby County had 1,322 arrests, with 175 of those being drug related

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and 446 alcohol related. These statistics were compiled by Texas Department of Public Safety. In 2009 the Shelby County District Attorney's office states, that during the course of an investigation, they discovered that approximately 90% of the cases that come through their office were motivated by drug use, or occurred in a direct attempt to gain money to purchase drugs. The Drug Court Program participation in Panola County is comprised of more than 55% of methamphetamine users, even with this small but increasing percentage of users, 50% of the methamphetamine users have also cooked it. The process of making methamphetamine is extremely dangerous and very toxic, not only to the people who cook it but to the whole community. The Drug Court program in Shelby County is comprised of 40% cocaine (smoke or snort) users, 23% methamphetamine users, 15% alcohol abusers and 22% other (marijuana, PCP, morphine, opiate, methadone). To reduce drug dependency, recidivism and incarceration, our Drug Court Program MUST continue to provide specialized supervision and rehabilitation programs to the offenders who want to make a change in their lives.

A priority which is set forth in the 123rd Judicial District Community Justice Plan's mission statement, is to enhance public safety by providing our courts with viable risk control management alternatives for criminal offenders, while making opportunities available to facilitate positive changes, should the offender choose to participate. Our project is the heart of the community justice plan's mission statement. The Drug Court uses behavior modification techniques, such as cognitive intervention, the Matrix program and intensive supervision to help offenders make a positive change. Offenders must attend and participate in individual and group counseling. Offenders also have the continued opportunity to attend (free of charge) GED classes, continuing education classes and vocational classes. They are also provided Narcotics Anonymous (NA) and Alcoholic Anonymous (AA), a minimum of twice weekly at the CSCD office. Offenders in Phase One of the Drug Court Program report to their specialized supervision officer, minimum of twice weekly, Drug Court Counselor a minimum of twice weekly, and report to drug court weekly. The offenders in the Drug Court Program have stringent rules set out before them, and a team of professionals, referred to as the Drug Court Team to enforce these rules. The program is a voluntary alternative for all offenders who want a positive change in their lives.

The goals of this project are to rehabilitate and reduce offender recidivism in our communities by the continuation of the intensive Drug Court Program. Our goal is to continue to rehabilitate offenders, using a non-adversarial court approach, thus reducing recidivism. A 50% drop on substance abuse is still anticipated, as measured by the intoxilizer/urine screen results. We still project criminal activity will be lowered by 30% up to 3 years after completion, as measured by criminal history record checks. Assessment scores are expected to show a 20% improvement in social functioning, employment stability, educational attainment, relationship stability, amenability to treatment, and self satisfaction. Drug Court participants are able to enter the treatment 50% faster than other offenders. Outcomes will be measured through a comprehensive drug court evaluation. The Drug Court team is hopeful that each participant has the desire to make a positive change in their life and not allow the use of drugs to rule their actions.

With the continued increase of methamphetamine use, "crack" cocaine and alcohol abuse problems in this region, the jails continue to be overcrowded, the long anticipated wait for a SAFFP bed, funding cuts for TAIP, no local ISF's there needs to be additional specialized alternatives, such as court intervention, which needs to be continued.

The continued overcrowding of the Texas Prison System and both of our county jails means early release, which makes attempts by the court to lessen drug abuse and drug related crimes, ineffective. In the last year this district has had 1,598 arrests for drug or alcohol related crimes. Our continued goal as a Drug Court is to enhance public safety, by reducing recidivism and offering a risk controlled treatment alternative for drug abusers. The program will improve the lives of the drug

abusers and the community in which they live. The Drug Court targets males and females above 17 years of age, who have an identified drug or alcohol problem, with no history of violence or sexual offenses. The Drug Court Program offers assistance in several areas: counseling for individuals, families and in group settings, basic adult education, GED preparation, vocational training, job searches, dual diagnosis/mental health care, AA/NA groups, relapse prevention and if desired spiritual support. 

Integration of Services - The integration between alcohol and other drug treatment services in the processing of cases in the judicial system

The integration between alcohol and other drug treatment services in the processing of cases in the judicial system. While in drug court, a defendant has access to several different meeting places which are designed to accommodate different types of addiction. Alcoholics have different needs from those who strictly abuse prescription or illegal drugs and of course there are those individuals who are reliant on both alcohol and drugs. We use AA to help those cope with being an alcoholic and we use NA to help those who suffer from a more substance related addiction. There are also non-formal meeting places where some offenders feel more relaxed but still have a positive atmosphere conducive to sobriety. Treatment Centers are located all over Texas with the goal of rehabilitating offenders. While those treatment facilities are usually regarded as a last measure of sanction prior to revocation of probation, they are utilized none the less. Defendants, in most cases, can be admitted in to the Centers and come back with more of a chance at a lasting sobriety.

**Non-Adversarial Approach** – The use of a non-adversarial approach involving prosecutors and defense attorneys to promote public safety and to protect the due process rights of program participants  
There are staffings that are held at the first of the month and various unscheduled times that keep Drug Court team members involved and up to date on probation cases and progress. Defendants are made aware of the fact that they have a Defense lawyer who keeps their best legal interests in mind while also contributing ideas and/or sanctions to the Drug Court staff. Not having the typical District attorney who is usually against or is trying to prosecute the defendant, helps the Defendant feel more comfortable about being honest and up front with all drug court staff members involved. As the Defense attorney, the prosecuting attorney and the Judge get together and hold a staff meeting with the Counselor and Probation officer, it becomes more possible to figure a way to either sanction or show approval toward however a given Defendant is complying.

**Prompt Placement** – Early identification and prompt placement of eligible participants in the program.  
Early identification of eligible candidates for Drug Court is important, however it is not always the case due to some Defendants' abilities to camouflage their addiction or deceive their officers. It takes the coordination of everyone involved to identify those eligible individuals. Identification can come from reading through a docket and deciding during plea bargaining or it may come from a probation officer who refers an offender who they feel really needs the extra supervision and / or help. An individual who has numerous possession charges as well as failed Drug Tests throws a red flag for detection so that prompt placement is possible.

**Access** – Access to a continuum of alcohol, drug, and other related treatment and rehabilitative services  
Access to a continuum of Drug and alcohol related services is important for an individual to remain sober and free of drugs after he or she has been discharged from the Drug Court program and more importantly after they have been discharged from probation and are on their own in society.

**Abstinence Monitoring** – Monitoring of abstinence through weekly alcohol and other drug testing  
Monitoring a person's sobriety is not always 100 percent possible due to deceptive probationers. Weekly testing in the early stages of the program is reason enough for an individual to stay sober; however, that obviously does not always happen. Home visits and surprise drug testing are ways to keep probationers guessing and also ways to monitor sobriety. Honesty plays a big part in the program because of the fact that monitoring is not always full-proof. Dishonesty is not tolerated and more strictly sanctioned when discovered.

**Compliance Strategy** – A coordinated strategy to govern program responses to participants' compliance.  
It is impossible to know for sure if the program is working because different strategies work for different people. One can review the recidivism rate of those who graduate and speak to family members and friends about that individual in hopes of getting a truthful answer on how they are coping after graduation. Often, a simple arrest report will tell the truth. A coordinated strategy between the district Attorney's investigator and the CSO can be helpful. Sometimes people from the streets will give information on certain individuals who may or may not have been in drug court. This can sometimes tell if a certain person is doing well and staying sober or if he or she is not.

**Judicial Interaction** – Ongoing judicial interaction with program participants  
An interaction between the Drug court staff and the Defendant in a formal courtroom setting tends to remind the Defendant that he is still held accountable and still has obligations to fulfill. Seeing the Judge dressed in the black robe triggers a psychological response which tends to keep the Defendants' crime or reason for being in Drug Court fresh in his mind.

**Evaluation** – Monitoring and evaluation of program goals and effectiveness  
Program goals are ultimately sobriety. There are secondary goals such as getting a GED, or obtaining a driver's license. Finding a job is an obtainable goal which helps the others fall in place, so while it is not the primary goal it is usually one that is first on the list. Monitoring effectiveness can be studied by recidivism rates or by staying in touch with individual who have graduated the program. They can advise whether or not the program actually helped them or if they were just successfully deceived.

**Education** – Continuing interdisciplinary education to promote effective program planning, implementation, and operations  
Our Drug Court CSO does have to prove ongoing education in the form of different training held throughout the state of Texas. Interdisciplinary education is helpful as it provides different ideas and thinking that would otherwise not be learned and utilized. With the Grants being cut as they have been the past several years, it is difficult and almost impossible to send the Drug Court CSO to actual Drug Court Conferences that are outside of Texas.

**Partnerships** – Development of partnerships with public agencies and community organizations  
Our Drug Court CSO keeps close communication with other public agencies in the county. The City Police Department as well as the Sheriff's Department and CPS try to be as helpful as they can be when it comes to either keeping that extra eye out for certain individuals or providing input and ideas of how to deal with certain individuals and circumstances.

This 123rd Judicial District Adult Drug Court program (which includes Panola & Shelby Counties, 2010 U.S. census population of 49,244) is designed to address the continued substance abuse issues and recidivism rates. Sentences for these offenders still vary from county jail and prison time, specialized community supervision, drug dependency treatment (inpatient/outpatient), and judicial intervention. These alternatives alone have not reduced the recidivism among drug offenders. Drug Abuse continues to escalate in the 123rd Judicial District. The Panola and Shelby county jails and the prison system continue at maximum capacity. The drug trafficking corridor appears to be on the increase also, this includes. US Highway 59, Interstate 20, Interstate 30, and introducing Interstate 49 and the future of US Highway 69, all of which run through or near to both counties, make illegal drugs still readily available. Panola & Shelby counties make up the 123rd Judicial District, each county still has different drug abuse patterns due to their socio-economic status. Shelby County's main drug problem continues to be "crack" cocaine, but now has the uprising use of methamphetamines. Panola County's main drug of problem continues to be methamphetamines. Drug offenders continually abusing drugs, making them a part of their lifestyle, resulting in ongoing criminal activity and re-occurring problems within the communities.

The volume of arrests in the 123rd Judicial District is an indicator of the need for continued intervention, such as the Drug Court Program. In the period from January 2010 to December 2010, there were 1,118 arrests in Panola County, which 90 of those arrests were drug related and 276 were alcohol related. During the same time period, Shelby County had 1,322 arrests, with 175 of those being drug related.

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and 446 alcohol related. These statistics were compiled by Texas Department of Public Safety. In 2009 the Shelby County District Attorney's office states, that during the course of an investigation, they discovered that approximately 90% of the cases that come through their office were motivated by drug use, or occurred in a direct attempt to gain money to purchase drugs. The Drug Court Program participation in Panola County is comprised of more than 55% of methamphetamine users, even with this small but increasing percentage of users, 50% of the methamphetamine users have also cooked it. The process of making methamphetamine is extremely dangerous and very toxic, not only to the people who cook it but to the whole community. The Drug Court program in Shelby County is comprised of 40% cocaine (smoke or snort) users, 23% methamphetamine users, 15% alcohol abusers and 22% other (marijuana, PCP, morphine, opiate, methadone). To reduce drug dependency, recidivism and incarceration, our Drug Court Program MUST continue to provide specialized supervision and rehabilitation programs to the offenders who want to make a change in their lives.

A priority which is set forth in the 123rd Judicial District Community Justice Plan's mission statement, is to enhance public safety by providing our courts with viable risk control management alternatives for criminal offenders, while making opportunities available to facilitate positive changes, should the offender choose to participate. Our project is the heart of the community justice plan's mission statement. The Drug Court uses behavior modification techniques, such as cognitive intervention, the Matrix program and intensive supervision to help offenders make a positive change. Offenders must attend and participate in individual and group counseling. Offenders also have the continued opportunity to attend (free of charge) GED classes, continuing education classes and vocational classes. They are also provided Narcotics Anonymous (NA) and Alcoholic Anonymous (AA), a minimum of twice weekly at the CSCD office. Offenders in Phase One of the Drug Court Program report to their specialized supervision officer, minimum of twice weekly, Drug Court Counselor a minimum of twice weekly, and report to drug court weekly. The goals of this project are to rehabilitate and reduce offender recidivism in our communities by the continuation of the intensive Drug Court Program. Our goal is to continue to rehabilitate offenders, using a non-adversarial court approach, thus reducing recidivism. A 50% drop on substance abuse is still anticipated, as measured by the intoxilizer/urine screen results. We still project criminal activity will be lowered by 30% up to 3 years after completion, as measured by criminal history record checks. Assessment scores are expected to show a 20% improvement in social functioning, employment stability, educational attainment, relationship stability, amenability to treatment, and self satisfaction. Drug Court participants are able to enter the treatment 50% faster than other offenders. Outcomes will be measured through a comprehensive drug court evaluation. The Drug Court team is hopeful that each participant has the desire to make a positive change in their life and not allow the use of drugs to rule their actions.

In the last year this district has had 1,598 arrests for drug or alcohol related crimes.
