WHEREAS, with early and effective treatment, those individuals with mental health conditions can recover and lead full, productive lives; and


WHEREAS, Community Healthcore is the local mental health authority assisting residents in nine East Texas counties including Panola County; and


WHEREAS, Community Healthcore serviced 633 Panola County residents in fiscal year 2025; and




